	Each SET DNST command specifies a timeout value for its corresponding SET DNS command. For example, the SET DNST1= command specifies the timeout value for the DNS server specified by the SET DNS1 command.
Syntax:	SET DNSTn=sec300
Arguments:	<i>n</i> - Numeric value, 1 through 4
	The DNS entry to set. Up to four Domain Name Servers can be used.
	sec300 - Numeric, 300 through 65535, in 300th seconds
	Specifies the timeout value to be used for the corresponding domain name server entry. The default value is 1200, or 4 seconds.
Example:	
IPN237I set IPN254I DNS	dnst1=1500 1 address is 65.24.7.3, Timeout is 1500
Related Commands:	QUERY OPTIONS-Displays the current values of modifiable parameters.SET DNS-Establishes a DNS server to be used for name resolution.
